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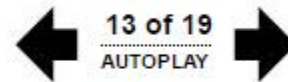

Mustique's The Cotton House Gets a Makeover

The storied Cotton House—the only hotel on the private Grenadine island of Mustique—has just reopened after a redesign of its Great Room and Veranda restaurant by French architect Tristan Auer (the mastermind behind London's uber cool Chiltern Firehouse). Auer has added much-needed tropical glamour to the tired French West Indies-meets-Caribbean interiors.
