



Marine Conservation

The Mustique Conservation area encompasses the entire island and extends 1000 yards from shore. This is a designated 'no-take' zone and a protected area for all animals and plants, including coral, fish, birds and reptiles.

Coral Reef Restoration

Coral reefs around the world are disappearing due to climate change and pollution. Mustique is undertaking an ambitious coral restoration program in hopes of improving the health of our surrounding reefs. In collaboration with Coral Restoration Foundation, we installed two nurseries - one in Endeavour Bay and the other in L'Ansecoy Bay. We are currently growing three species of coral and since 2015, over 2000 coral fragments have been out planted.

Sea Turtles

The Turtle Project – Mustique, in accordance with WIDECAST, protects and monitors sea turtles both on and offshore. Onshore, sea turtle nesting occurs between March and October every year.

Offshore, sea turtles spend time grazing through sea grass beds and along coral reefs throughout the year. Please respect the turtles on and around Mustique by not approaching or touching them.
