MOORING ON MUSTIQUE

Just three miles by one, Mustique and the surrounding waters have been identified as a designated Conservation Area, please join us in the stewardship of our island and help us protect this delicate ecosystem.

As a visitor arriving by boat we ask you to respect the following guidelines in order to help us achieve our mission:-

- If Mustique is your first destination in St. Vincent & the Grenadines, please do register your arrival with the Customs & Immigration Department, on +1 784 488 8410.
- Boats up to 60 ft. to use moorings provided in Britannia Bay, larger vessels please contact the moorings office on VHF 16/68 or 533 0216.
- Please observe the harbour speed limit of 5 knots to protect sea turtles that may be on the surface of the water and swimmers observing marine life below.

PRESERVING MUSTIQUE *“Help us to protect our Island”*

- Kindly note that the use of jet skis, water skis & spear guns or any type of fishing are prohibited.
- Animals are not permitted to come ashore, unless cleared by the Government Animal Health Department.
- There is a discretionary dress code, swimwear should be reserved for beach areas only and nudity is not allowed.
- Barbecue & picnic areas are reserved for homeowners & guests only and for safety reasons please do not use portable barbecues.
- Please respect the islander’s privacy and do not photograph private homes or guests. Drones are not permitted and from time to time cameras may be prohibited.
- In respect of our environmental conservation please do not touch or remove island flora & fauna.



EXPLORING MUSTIQUE

For day trips and tours, please note there is an additional head tax for non-Vincentian visitors of EC\$40.00 per person. Fees are payable at the Moorings office opposite the Jetty. A daily mooring/anchorage rate is available at \$300.

We kindly ask you to observe the following:

- Island bus tours are available on designated routes. These routes will vary from time to time during the busy season in order to protect areas throughout the island and to ensure the privacy of residents and guests. Beach and other location drop-offs are not permitted.
- Discharge of waste water is not permitted in the marine conservation area to ensure clean water for our marine life. Boats are required to use holding tanks whilst visiting Mustique. Please use trash bins provided around the island, and sort items where possible for recycling.
- The Turtle Project- Mustique, in accordance with WIDECAS, protects and monitors sea turtles both on and offshore. Onshore, sea turtle nesting occurs between March and October every year. Offshore, sea turtles spend time grazing through sea grass beds and along coral reefs throughout the year. Please respect the turtles on and around Mustique by not approaching or touching them.
- Water on Mustique is produced by desalination plants, which are partly powered by solar energy. Please conserve water where possible.
- In respect of our environmental conservation please stay within the designated visitor area and do not touch or remove island flora and fauna.
